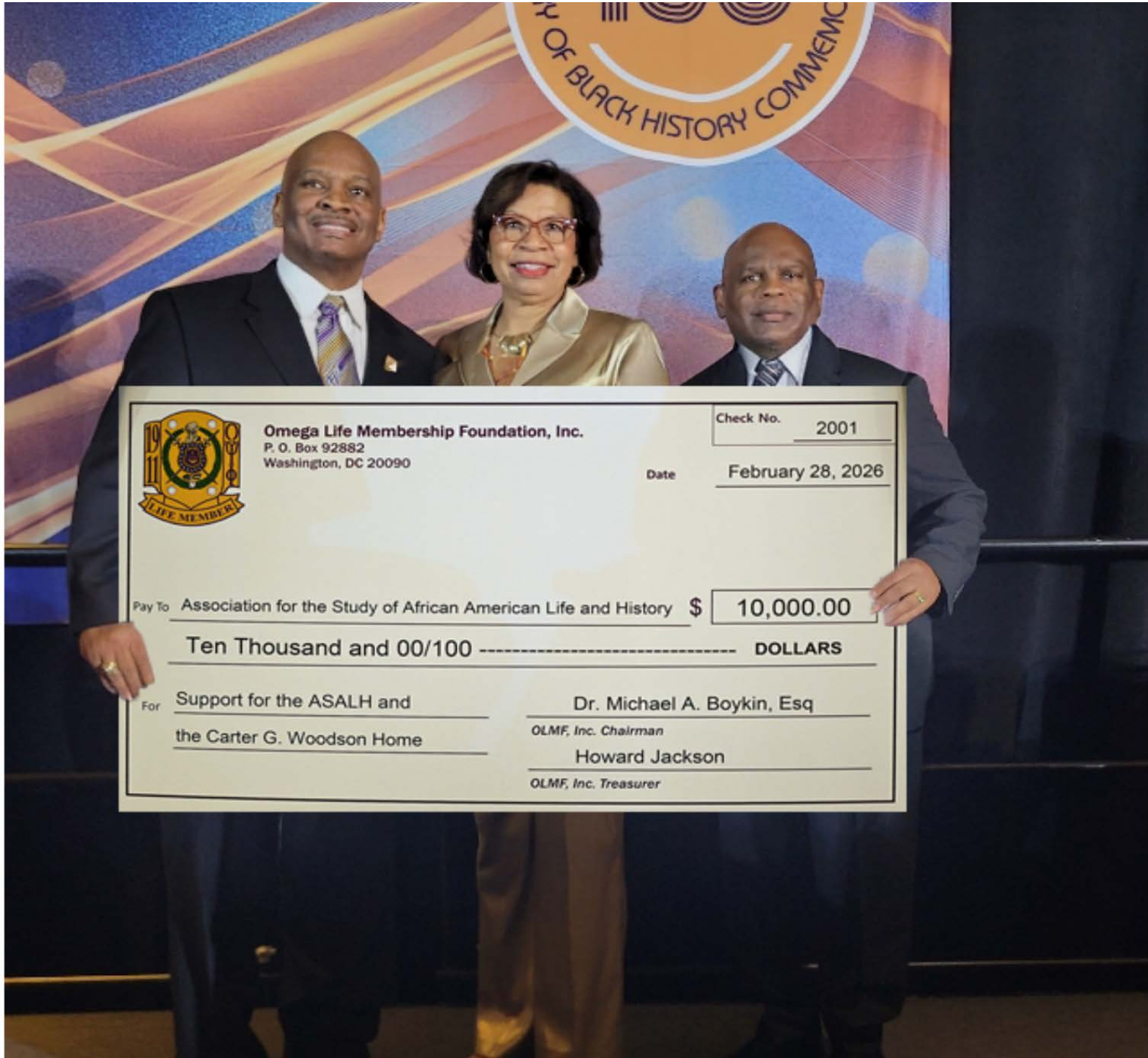

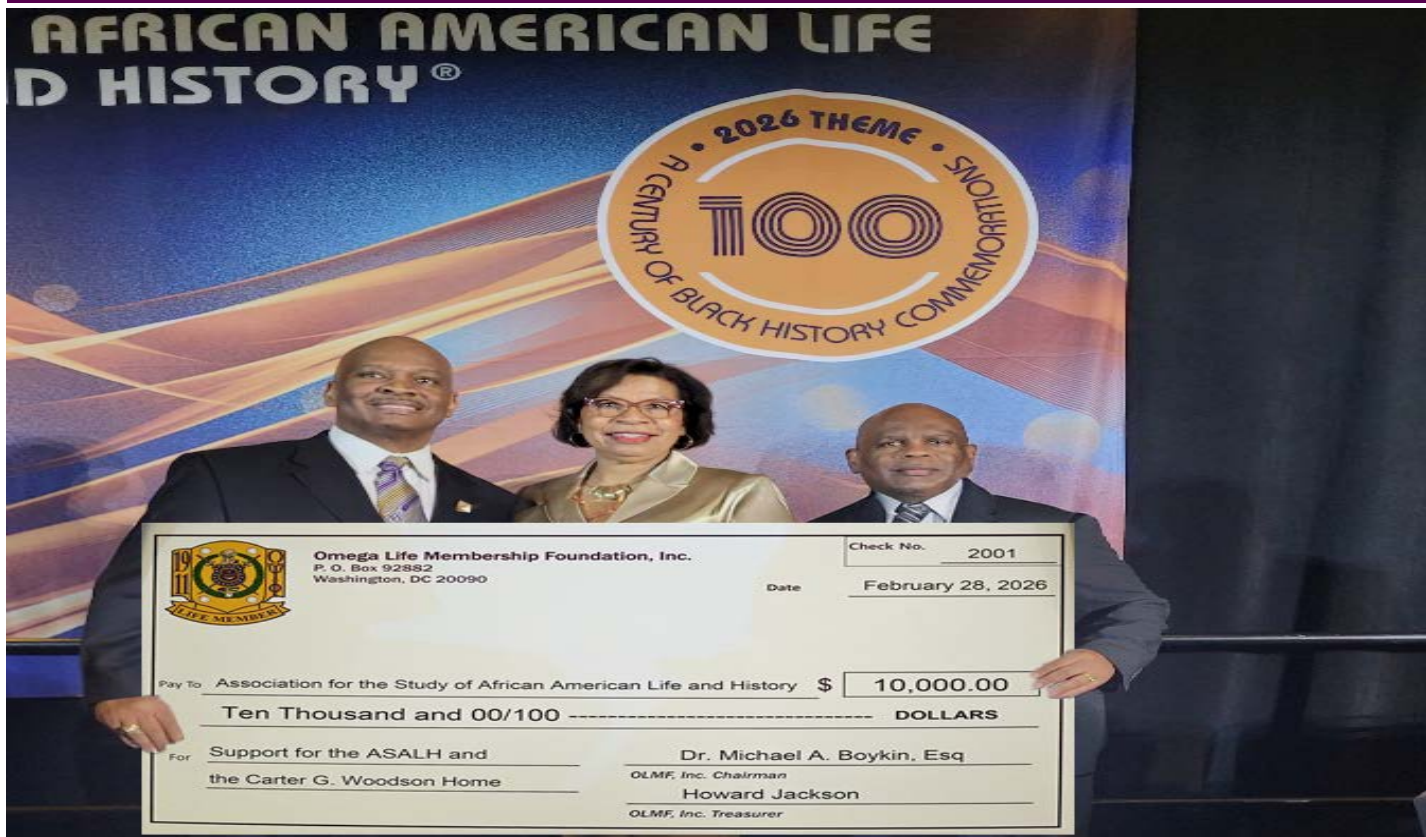

## INVESTMENT POLICY

The Board of Directors delegates the responsibility for investing the organization's capital assets to an **Investment Committee** composed of five to seven Board Members, with the Chairman of the Board of Directors being ex-officio. It is the responsibility of the Investment Committee to **develop strategies and guidelines and take investment actions that will produce the maximum total return on investments staying within levels of liquidity, and investment risks that are prudent and rational under the existing economic conditions.** The Treasurer will maintain all investment data and make all investment decisions approved by the Investment Committee and Executive Committee/Board of Directors.

The Investment Committee shall determine the proportions of the total endowment assets, which are invested in **fixed-income securities, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, exchange-traded funds (ETF), and cash or cash equivalents.** Dependent upon the market climate, the percentage range of investments could be from 30% to 70% for mutual funds, 30% to 70% for stocks and bonds and 5% to 20% for cash and cash equivalents, and 8% to 15% for alternative investments. Once the asset allocations are determined, and investments are made, the Committee will continually monitor performance and, **when necessary,** adjust budgets to maintain a desirable asset mix. Financial **assets must always be diversified** to minimize the risk of loss from any over-concentration of assets in a specific issue or class of securities. In addition, all securities or pools of securities selected **must have superior or an above average rating** according to Standard and Poor's and Moody. In making investment decisions, the Committee may, from time to time, seek the advice of reputable investment consultants.

The Investment Committee **may delegate to investment managers** the discretion to buy, sell or hold individual securities as described by this statement. In addition, the voting of corporate proxies may be delegated to approved independent third-party vendors. Performance reports shall be delivered every quarter, and investments' performance results shall be measured against industry benchmarks as applicable.

Investment dividends and income, as well as certificates of deposits and bond maturities, **must be staggered** to provide reasonable liquidity to fund the cash requirements of the Foundation. Earned funds designated for grants, should be placed in short-term investments, which mature just before the time grants are to be made.

All new endowment funds received must be deposited into the corporation's accounts and invested according to the OLMF investment policy guidelines.

The Investment Committee should meet in person or telephonically to review investment policies, the investment portfolio, and its performance and make investment recommendations to the Executive Committee/Board of Directors.

The Chairman of the Board of Directors may appoint, in consort with the Executive Committee/Board of Directors, up to three advisors who are members of the Omega Life Membership Foundation with the experience and knowledge to meet with and assist the Investment Committee with investment and fiscal policy decisions. This advisory group would serve on an annual basis.

- 3) Strategic thinker with a successful track record in Omega-related functions.

#### **B. Financial & Fundraising Acumen**

- 1) Strong understanding of budgeting, financial management, and fiduciary responsibility.
- 2) Ability to raise and contribute financial support annually.
- 3) Knowledge of financial investments and nonprofit financial operations.

#### **C. Teamwork & Communication**

- 1) Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- 2) Ability to work collaboratively while exercising independent judgment.
- 3) Proficiency in public speaking and donor engagement.

#### **D. Technical & Administrative Skills**

- 1) Familiarity with Microsoft Office Suite (Word, Excel, PowerPoint) and virtual meeting platforms.
- 2) Strong organizational, management, and strategic planning abilities.

## II. Commitment & Eligibility Requirements

- A) Must be a Life Member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.
- B) Should have attended at least two OLMF annual meetings.
- C) Willing to dedicate time, expertise, and financial resources to the Board.
- D) Fiduciary responsibilities must be upheld, and nonprofit governance standards must be adhered to.
- E) Must actively support and promote OLMF initiatives, including fundraising and program participation.
- F) Should have broad experience across various board-related committees.

## III. Expectations of Board Members

- A) Attend and actively participate in all Board meetings and relevant committee work.
- B) Provide strategic oversight and policy guidance for OLMF operations.
- C) Serve as an ambassador for OLMF, fostering relationships with donors, members, and partners.
- D) Represent and advocate for the interests of the Foundation within their respective regions or at-large capacity.
- E) Ensure the Foundation operates transparently and aligns with its mission.

Serving on the OLMF, Inc. Board of Directors is an esteemed responsibility that requires ***dedication, expertise, and a commitment*** to the Foundation's mission. Candidates should be prepared to contribute meaningfully through ***leadership, financial support, and active participation in governance and fundraising efforts***.

# Origin of the Omega Life Membership Program

**A**t the request of Grand Basileus Brother Herbert Tucker, National Executive Secretary Brother H. Carl Moultrie, Sr. recommended in his report to the 41st Grand Conclave in Atlanta, GA the institution of a Life Membership Program. This was the very beginning of the Life Membership Program in 1954. As of February 28, 2026, **16,311** Omega men have become Life Members and the program continues to attract more men of Omega every year.

The Life Membership Program was eventually voted into law by the Grand Conclave of 1958 in Cleveland, OH. In those early days, the program had accomplished very little. There was always a fear that such a program would destroy the local chapters. But over the years, this proved to be false.

The program was revived under Grand Basileus Brother James S. Avery and chaired by Brother Walter "Crow" Riddick. Under Brother Riddick's leadership, the number of Life Members rose from 47 to almost 300. By the time Brother Riddick entered Omega Chapter in 1977, the number of life members had risen to 1,000.

**The Omega Life Membership Foundation, Inc. was established on September 7, 1984.** It was chartered to aid organizations involved in charitable, educational, scholastic and scientific pursuits. Since its establishment, it has had tremendous growth and success and has been of significant benefit to those groups whose work it has been privileged to support.

There have been numerous young people, gifted in the performing arts, and in scholastic pursuits who were able to continue their progress, as a result of the generous, philanthropic work of the Foundation. It has supported a number of Uplift and Scholastic projects and initiatives started and endorsed by the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc.

The Articles of Incorporation were filed in the District of Columbia on September 8, 1984 and Amended Articles of Incorporation filed on March 14, 1985. The purposes for which the corporation is organized are to take, receive, acquire, own, have, and hold the life membership estate, assets, funds, principal, income monies, accounts, grants, donations, gifts and properties both real and personal, tangible and intangible, for such uses and purposes and with such powers, duties, and obligations as are set forth in the charter and corporate bylaws.



We, the undersigned natural persons of the age of twenty-one years or more, acting as incorporators of a corporation, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation pursuant to the District of Columbia NON-PROFIT CORPORATION ACT (D.C. Code Title 29, Chapter 10);

FIRST: The Name of the Corporation is OMEGA LIFE MEMBERSHIP FOUNDATION, INC.

SECOND: The period duration is PERPETUAL.

THIRD: The purpose or purposes for which the corporation is organized are (a) to take, receive, acquire, own, have, and hold, the life membership estate, dues, assets, funds, principal, income, monies, accounts and properties both real and personal, tangible and intangible, of the individual life members of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Incorporated, for such uses and purposes and with such powers, duties and obligations as are set forth, in this Charter and in the corporate by-laws or which are established by any Trust Instrument duly authorized, adopted and enacted. (b) In general, to do any and all acts and things, and to exercise any and all powers which it may now hereafter be lawful for the Corporation to do or exercise under and pursuant to the laws of the District of Columbia for the purpose of accomplishing any of the purposes of the Corporation. (c) To seek an exemption from taxation pursuant to 26 U.S.C. §501(c). (d) The Corporation shall not engage nor shall any substantial portion of its assets, funds, property or income be used in carrying on propaganda or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, nor shall the Corporation participate in or intervene in (including the publishing or distributing of


